HUMAN RELATIONS SUNDAY


January 15, 2023

New beginnings or new years, are about moving into areas or places that might seem unfamiliar and in many cases challenges us to grow spiritually in ways we never expected. In this new year of 2023 I invite you to move on to "higher ground." Also, I invite you to live a life of "motion" this year. Making certain that we are moving into those areas God is calling us to be in order to provide ministry to a world that needs to hear more about Jesus Christ than ever.

As we start the year 2023, we move into the season of Epiphany. Epiphany is the climax of the Advent/Christmas Season and the Twelve Days of Christmas, which are usually counted from the evening of December 25th until the morning of January 6th, which is the Twelfth Day. In following this older custom of counting the days beginning at sundown, the evening of January 5th is the Twelfth Night. This is an occasion for feasting in some cultures, including the baking of a special King's Cake as part of the festivities of Epiphany (a King's Cake) is part of the observance of Mardi Gras in French Catholic culture of the Southern USA), which I look forward to eating each year.

However, Epiphany is not just about eating and feasting, it is about celebrating the Lord's appearance and His moving the world from darkness to light. The term epiphany means "to show" or "to make known" or even "to reveal."

As a church family, let us move into the mindset of moving and journeying with those around us that they may come to know our Lord Jesus Christ and that we may be for the world to see a great light revealed in the midst of darkness!

Proof of light



On January 6 Christians celebrate Epiphany, when the Magi came to worship baby Jesus. Epiphany, which means an appearance or manifestation, symbolizes the first recognition of the Savior by non-Jews. Because Epiphany also is a reminder that Jesus came as the light of the whole world, its symbols include light, candles and a star.

How did the wise men know — and how do we know — that Jesus is the light of the world? As preacher George Buttrick said, "It would little avail to ask how we know. That would be like asking how we know that Beethoven's 'Hymn to Joy' is joyous. If a man were to say, 'It is not joyous to me,' he would not condemn the music; he would tell only his morbidity. There is no logic to establish an axiom, for an axiom is the basis of all logic; and the soul of Jesus has axiomatic truth. Jesus is light, and there is no proof for light except light itself."
