Dear Sunny Lane Family,

We have finished the first quarter of 2024 and are firmly in the second as we settle into the new Leadership Board Model. Just as a quick review, it is a different model than we have ever used, but it is one that I am familiar with, having served my twenty plus years on the Mid-Del school board. Our nine person board met for the first time on January 28 to begin our work. building on the Mission, Vision and Plan (MVP) that the Visioning Team developed in 2023. Our first meeting was organizational. I was elected as chair, Virginia Park volunteered to be our minute's taker and Alice Hutchinson agreed to be the Guiding Principles Guru, tracking our Guiding Principles as we create them. We were pleased to have Rev Thomas Hoffman, interim pastor at Church of the Servant and Single Accountable Structure Coach for Sunny Lane. lead us in our discussion of what the Leadership Board is and isn't. We were given homework, reading "The Coming Revolution in Church Economics," by Mark DeYmaz which we will continue to read and discuss as a group.

At our March and April meetings, we approved a breakeven budget for 2024, but continued to be frustrated by our transition to the new financial system taking an excessive amount of time to finalize. Our internal financial team of Donna Alexander and Barbara Zapf have been extremely diligent in completing their work. We continue to work toward having current financial statements available.

We are currently reviewing all policies and procedures for Sunny Lane and to put in place a consistent process to review and update all policies.

The Building and Grounds Committee has been very busy in getting bids for upgrading our restrooms to be more handicapped accessible.

We have seen over the past 4 months, a great deal of enthusiasm for completing a shared goal of funding a Children's Director. We did have several fundraisers from various groups and activities. I am thrilled that we have seen groups and individuals who have not played a leadership role before step forward to make this goal happen!

The Leadership Board meets on the first Sunday of each month and is open to the entire congregation with the exception of when we go into executive session on personnel matters. We will also have Town Hall meetings periodically at which we will update the congregation and will have a time to specifically answer questions from Sunny Lane members. I look forward to seeing many of you at our first Town Hall Meeting on May 5 after 2<sup>nd</sup> service.

I am proud to serve as Leadership Chair as we continue to live our MVP here at Sunny Lane United Methodist Church.

This year, our annual conference offering will be taken in honor of the ministry of Bishop Jimmy Nunn, who will be retiring as our episcopal leader on September 1, 2024 after serving in ministry for 43 years. The offering will be used to fund a makerspace at Lydia Patterson Institute ("LPI"). At LPI, they are going to create a dynamic environment where the students can unleash their creativity, collaborate on projects, and solve real-world problems. It will include state-of-the-art amenities – 3D printers whirring to life, computer stations humming with research and design, workshop tables buzzing with activity, and TV screens illuminating presentations and demonstrations.

LPI's vision for this makerspace goes beyond mere renovation; it's about aligning with their educational mission. By repurposing this space, they will be able to create an environment that not only supports curriculum standards but also fosters hands-on learning through building. The makerspace will serve as a catalyst for collaboration and growth. As students work together, they will not only enhance their academic skills but also practice English conversational skills, bridging language barriers and fostering inclusion. When you give to this offering, you are investing in tools and equipment; you are investing in the future of LPI's wonderful students.

Bishop Nunn has a particular fondness for LPI having served on the board there for many years. This will be a great way to honor him. You can give two ways:
